RE: Stage 1 Water Conservation Suspended

Dear Meridian Ranch residents and water customers:

Thank you for cooperating over the summer with our Stage 1 water conservation efforts. Due to the recent construction of a booster pump station for our raw water supply and the current weather outlook, the District is suspending the Stage 1 Water Conservation in place since June.

The Meridian Service Metropolitan District (MSMD) is a quasi-governmental entity under Colorado law. The District was formed for the purpose of providing water, sewer, parks and recreation and street lights to the community of Meridian Ranch.

Providing reliable and clean water affects the quality of life in the MSMD service area. Since Colorado is a semi-arid region, water will always be one of our most precious resources.

Meridian Ranch has water supplies sufficient to support the planned growth of the development. The Antler Creek golf course is irrigated with non-potable recycled water to minimize its impact. The MSMD Board of Directors adopted a water conservation program. It is part of the overall water resources management that ensures adequate water supplies, especially during the peak-use summer months when landscapes are irrigated. As with many communities in Colorado, Meridian Ranch is actively seeking additional long-term sustainable water supplies. With good stewardship, we can extend the life of our existing supplies and reduce the demands for new resources and for construction of new water delivery infrastructure.

MSMD requests customers observe the conservation stage in effect from time to time. Water Conservation Guidelines are posted on the MSMD website. If the water conservation levels change, customers will be informed via signage throughout the community, along with updates on the web site www.MeridianRanchMetro.org.
